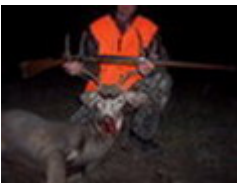

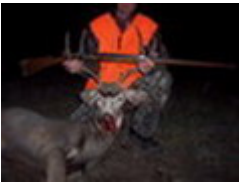
I sent this article to my brother after his experience and he bought 6 packs. He shot a doe on the last day of ML season in NY, and had excellent performance.

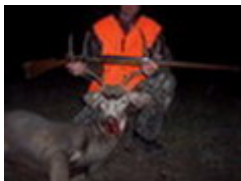

To the right of the flint, are 2 power belts, 295 grain aero tips fired frc 25 yards, The whole bullet is the one that went totally through a log that was powerbelt next to it, is one that didnt go through but went a total of 11inches. point is the 250 grain sabotooth that fell out of my barrel lol. What do u guy want to put it to good use so i never have to look at it again.
